

Description of Duties for Greeter at Carnivore Center

PLACE:

Carnivore Center to greet people as they get off the Safari Transports and talk to visitors as they walk around the grounds.

TIME:

Meet at the Johnson Visitor Center at 10 a.m. to be transported along with staff to the Carnivore Center. Plan to be there from 10 a.m. to 2 or 3 p.m. on tour days. We ask for at least one day per month or more during the season.

DUTIES:

- 1) Welcome visitors as they arrive.
- 2) Remind them of safety precautions at the Carnivore Center (especially kids, no running or climbing.)
- 3) On busy days, if more than one volunteer is present, you may want to split up and work both the upper and lower sections of the Carnivore Center.
- 4) Refer visitors to available staff who can answer questions.
- 5) Chat with visitors while they are waiting for buses.
- 6) Be well informed about the Wilds and the animals at Carnivore.
- 7) Be familiar with use of radios and proper procedures in case of emergencies. If a staff member forgets to give you a radio, ask for one. Occasionally we have a shortage of radios. If one is not available you may need to ask staff members at Carnivore to assist.

Qualifications:

- 1) Ability to stand and walk for several hours.
- 2) Ability to be outdoors in heat and sun or other weather conditions.
- 3) Willingness to engage people in conversation.
- 4) Good listener.

BENEFITS:

- 1) Meet lots of wonderful people from Ohio and other states and countries.
- 2) Work with terrific staff.
- 3) Observe the animals.

Dress Code:

- 1) Nametag should be worn if available.
- 2) Khaki pants or shorts (close to knee-length.)
- 3) Red Wilds Volunteer shirt (must be purchased.)
- 4) Neat, clean appearance.
- 5) No logos other than the Wilds.
